

Interpublic Supplier Management Principles (SP&P 382)



Interpublic Group of Companies Last Revised: July 2023 The Interpublic Group of Companies, including its subsidiaries (collectively, "IPG," the "Company" or "us") is a purpose-driven company, committed to achieving the highest standards in environmental, social and governance (ESG) practices. As a leading global provider of marketing solutions, IPG recognizes the impact that our business activities can have on the world around us, and we are committed to operating our business with the highest standards of integrity and with sustainable practices. IPG seeks to engage suppliers and business partners who share our values and standards, and who uphold this commitment in the work they do for IPG.

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Scope

This Policy covers all companies in the IPG network around the world, and applies to all suppliers, including their employees, agents and subcontractors.

By "supplier" we mean any company, organization or individual that provides a product or service to IPG or indirectly to any of its clients.

Policy

Supplier Code Of Conduct: All of our suppliers are required to agree to comply with our Supplier Code of Conduct (the "Code" or "Supplier Code of Conduct"), which is available on our <u>Corporate</u> <u>Governance</u> webpage, and to disclose any potential conflicts as part of that process.

IPG employees who are engaged in selecting or retaining suppliers are expected to use reasonable efforts to require suppliers to agree to comply with the Code.

Governance & Oversight: Each year, IPG purchases products and services from more than 75,000 suppliers around the world, guided by our Strategic Sourcing & Procurement (SS&P) team as part of the Strategic Program Office.

Oversight and enforcement of this Policy and the Supplier Code of Conduct are the responsibility of IPG senior management. IPG's Controller function leads our efforts in this area – with support from Business Controls, Business Transformation and Legal/Corporate Compliance.

The IPG Board of Directors reviews and considers the implications of social responsibility issues that affect the Company. The Board's Corporate Governance and Social Responsibility Committee oversees issues of global corporate citizenship and social responsibility and makes recommendations to the full Board regarding the Company's policies and practices on these issues.

Supplier Code Of Conduct – Matters Covered

The Supplier Code of Conduct shall require IPG suppliers and their representatives to conduct their business activities in full compliance with applicable laws and regulations, act with integrity, and to make commitments regarding anti-corruption compliance, privacy, security and data protection and employment practices, among other values. The Code shall also require suppliers to acknowledge and share our commitments to sustainability and human rights, as described below.

- Legal Compliance and Ethical Business Practices: The Code shall set forth detailed requirements and expectations that our suppliers will comply with laws and act with integrity in connection with providing services to IPG.
- **Sustainability:** IPG is committed to the highest environmental standards and fulfillment of our responsibility on climate action, protecting natural resources, limiting pollution and being transparent about our progress. The Code shall require suppliers to share in our commitment to sustainability and to comply with all applicable environmental laws and regulations.
- **Diversity:** IPG is committed to working with partners that reflect the diversity of our world, our stakeholders, our clients and our clients' customers. The Code shall communicate IPG's commitment to supplier diversity.
- Human Rights: The Code shall provide that suppliers are expected to adhere to our Human Rights Policy (SP&P 423), including but not limited to fair working conditions, ensuring health and safety, protecting the rights to organize and vote, and providing a fair and living wage.

Supplier Selection & Risk Management Program

The SS&P team at IPG applies a disciplined approach to supplier selection and risk management, particularly in the categories where we have significant spend. Our standard process for strategic sourcing includes due diligence to assess key criteria such as financial strength, capabilities, capacity, quality of products and services, and commitment to diversity and sustainability.

With the support of the Board of Directors, IPG also implements a Third-Party Risk Management (TPRM) process to assist in identifying, assessing and managing risks that can arise when conducting business with third parties. With any supplier assessed as high-risk, the TPRM process involves an initial evaluation to assess any inherent risks. The supplier is then required to answer detailed questionnaires and provide supporting documentation, which are used to make a final assessment.

IPG's management initiatives around supplier criteria and supplier management have resulted in the creation of a preferred vendor list of vetted thirdparty suppliers, which is readily available to all of our companies in the U.S. and is being expanded. The criteria for selecting preferred suppliers relate to capability, credibility and price, as well as diversity and inclusion, human rights and environmental impact.

Communication

This Policy and the Code will be communicated throughout IPG and is available for public review. It will be reviewed on a regular basis to evaluate continued relevance, to monitor compliance and to drive continual improvement.

Reporting Concerns

If any of our stakeholders believe that an IPG employee, supplier or other business partner is in violation of this Policy, the Supplier Code of Conduct, or any laws or regulations, they are strongly encouraged to report the situation immediately.
